- Echium Candy Floss This is the first white form we have grown of this perennial, shrubby, bush-forming plant, which can be smothered with a hundred or more swollen trusses of flowers.
- Aristolochia Fimbriata Quite amazing exotic green flowers with purple-brown, yellow-veined insides, are surrounded by attractive, silverveined leaves festooning this unusual, drought-resistant, trailing and climbing plant.
- Dierama Adelphicum A new, valuable, very rare, and relatively dwarf species recently collected from Swaziland, with shocking-pink, flared, bell-shaped flowers in compact clusters, on dense, erect clumps. This is an absolute stunning new plant.
- Puya Berteroana An exquisite, surprisingly hardy pineapple relative producing rosettes of pineapple-shaped, silvery-green leaves beneath stout spikes of exotic, waxy, emeraldturquoise, lily-like flowers.



Our gardens constantly throw up surprises in the form of lovely quite unique new plants which have self-seeded in the borders, dozens popping up each year, and the very best of these are currently being developed by companies for large scale production in coming years. Watch this space!

How To Sow Your Seeds

- Sow all seeds as soon as you receive them unless otherwise advised on the packet.
- Use sterile compost. We recommend John Innes.
- Sow seed thinly and cover to about twice the depth of the seed size with fine grit or coarse sand.
- Do remember mousetraps and slug pellets. (Note: Please be careful if you have children or pets).
- Sow cold-germinating seeds in a cold frame or unheated greenhouse.
- Do be patient. Some seedlings appear in a few days whilst others may take several months, or even a year or more. DO NOT throw the seed tray away!
- Store warm-germinating seed in a fridge and sow in March or April in a heated greenhouse or propagator or in a well-lit spot on a window sill.
- Do not leave seedlings in a seed tray for too long. They often simply stop growing.

Have you discovered something new? A new Meconopsis perhaps?!

Please let us know if anything new, unusual or variegated appears in your garden. And do keep writing to us if you have any suggestions or advice, as we are always pleased to hear how you are doing. And thanks for buying and growing our seeds!

ABUTILON (VITIFOLIUM) X SUNTENSE

£2.75 Malvaceae HHSh 1.8m

This frost hardy plant is surely the most desirable of all mallow relatives. Clusters of large, bowlshaped, pale to deep purple flowers, with the occasional white flowered form, open from late spring to summer over a foil of felted grey-green leaves.



ACONITUM NAPELLUS

£2.65 Ranunculaceae HP

The true "Monkshood" flowers from earliest spring, producing indigo-blue hooded flowers on strong stems clad in shiny green leaves. This is one of the earliest, easiest and most rewarding flowers you can grow in the garden and is totally trouble-free.



ACANTHUS MOLLIS

£2.95 Acanthaceae

This hardy, statuesque, handsome plant has large ornamental glossy leaves and strong spikes of very lovely 'hooded' pink and cream flowers which over the years make impressive clumps. A superb. long-lived plant that makes a perpetual statement.

ACONITUM VULPARIA

£2.85 Ranunculaceae HP Long-lived clumps produce very dense sprays of pale sulphur vellow hooded flowers in spring and early summer, above attractive, bright green shiny foliage. If dead-headed flowering will continue into the autumn.

These delightful, dainty gems are bulbous perennials with linear leaves and nodding, bellshaped, pure white or occasionally pink, fragrant flowers, which open with or before the leaves in late summer. Clumps multiply reliably.



ACONITUM 'IVORINE'

£2.95 Ranunculaceae HP

This rare parchment white form of Aconitum septentrionale is a superb variety with an erect bushy habit bearing clusters of ivory white hooded flowers, with deeply fingered dark green glossy leaves which appear in early spring. It grows best in fertile, well-drained soil.



AGAPANTHUS 'HEADBOURNE HYBRIDS'

£2.95 Liliaceae ΗP Huge true blue globular heads

flower freely on stout stems above robust clumps of strapshaped leaves. This seemingly completely hardy variety forms thick established clumps which improve over the years and impress all who visit our gardens here.



AGAPANTHUS WHITE DWARF

£3.20 Liliaceae

White trumpets open on short stems above green strap-like leaves. This dwarf gem performs beautifully grown in open ground or a pot. It is long-lived and extremely hardy. Visitors to our hilltop gardens in Devon often doubt that this tiny plant is indeed an African lily.

AGASTACHE FOENICULUM 'GOLDEN JUBILEE'

Discovered here and given the 'All America Award'. Early spring crowns of purplish, crinkled leaves transform into sweetly aromatic golden rosettes, with tubby terminal spikes of fluffy lavender flowers. Superb in a welldrained spot.



AIPHANES EGGERSII

£2.95 Arecaceae

HHT,G 1.0-6.0m (4 seeds)

This rarely-seen, small / medium-size palm is native to the seasonally dry forests on Ecuador's Pacific coast. It produces yellow flowers, the fruit and it's single red seed are edible. Multiple stems of slim trunks and foliage split into clusters of feathered leaflets.



ALLIUM CAERULEUM

£2.85 Alliaceae

60cm (10 seeds)

This beautiful free-flowering allium opens its balls of bright blue flowers just as the clumps of long, linear leaves die back in early summer. This is perfect plant for a sunny border where it will thrive in a hot, welldrained spot.(RHS Award of Garden Merit).



ALLIUM CHRISTOPHII

Magnificent, ten inch, spherical heads composed of glossy amethystine violet stars (which can be dried to give pleasure all vear) will turn heads for years to come. Undoubtedly one of the most flamboyant members of this enormous family of plants.

ALLIUM PSKEMENSE

Attractive rounded heads of green-white flowers open on thick stems from June to August. A rare and very lovely plant, first collected from the Pskem range and Akbulak valley in Uzbekistan. It has also apparently been sold as A.cepa 'Kew White'. Few good seeds.



ALONSOA MERIDIONALIS REBEL

£2.75 Scrophulariacea HHP

Strong, branching stems with dark green shiny leaves produce a very long succession of dazzling crimson/scarlet flowers. This vigorous plant, perennial in warmer countries, will flower in as little as 12 weeks from sowing.



ALSTROEMERIA AURANTIACA

£2.25 Alstroemeriacea HP

We offer a generous packet from our sizeable stock beds of "Peruvian Lilies". These hardy and trouble-free spectacular plants form slowly expanding clumps of orchid-like orange and yellow blooms which improve unattended over the years.



ALSTROEMERIA HOOKERI

£3.20 Alstroemeriacea HP

Short stems carry large, distinguished, rose coloured flowers, attractively marked with crimson and vellow. Spreads steadily for several years giving a large bone-dry rock garden a reliable midsummer blaze of colour but setting very few seeds.

ALSTROEMERIA LIGTU HYBRIDS



AMARYLLIS VITTATA 'RED GIANT' (HIPPEASTRUM)

£3.20 Amaryllidaceae HHP

Seeds from the largest flowered amarvllis we have ever grown here, with 20 absolutely gigantic, blood-red flowers on multiple stems as the resulting bulbs double up yearly. Seedlings should produce their first flowers in year 2 and bulbs increase in size constantly.



AMSONIA ORIENTALIS

£2.95 Apocynaceae

This desirable native of Greece and Asia Minor has rich blue flowers which are larger and last longer than other varieties and slim lance shaped foliage. This rarely seen beauty deserves greater popularity. It is wellbehaved and runs very slowly. Few good seeds collected.



ANDROSACE CYLINDRICA

£2.95 Primulaceae

A choice dwarf species and one of the easier to grow. A tiny plant, resembling Androsace ciliata, During April and May it forms mossy tufts of rounded cone-like columns, each less than an inch high, covered thickly with hairs, with white flowers nestling in the centre.



ANDROSACE HIRTELLA

£3.70 Primulaceae

This rare, beautiful and rewarding species has shortstemmed, yellow-eyed white flowers and small linear green leaves which form in rosettes. In cultivation it thrives in welldrained, non limy compost. This variety does well outdoors in tufa, preferring winter cover.



ANEMONE HUPEHENSIS 'SEPTEMBER CHARM'

HP

£2.75 Ranunculaceae HP

This anemone brings valuable colour to the garden in late summer and autumn, with masses of large, rosy pink, cupshaped flowers on tall, wiry stems from July to September. One of the most reliable and free-flowering of the Japanese anemones.



ANEMONE LEVEILLEI

£2.65 Ranunculaceae HP

This one of the easiest and longlived of the clump-forming anemonies which improves with age, bearing dense sprays of white waxy-petalled flowers with a blue reverse. An exceptionally beautiful flower from China.



ANEMONE TOMENTOSA

£2.55 Ranunculaceae HP

This lovely Chinese species gives a valuable late summer and autumn display of large rose pink flowers in profuse clusters on long stalks, which make perfect cut flowers. Clouds of decorative woolly seed pods remain on the plant until late in the year.



ANEMONE x FULGENS

£2.85 Ranunculaceae HP

The flame anemone is a bright beacon due to it's vibrant red flowers on slim stems with pretty, divided foliage, Suited to loamy well drained soils, it likes partial shade in a sunny spot. Ideal for containers, it will turn a border or rock garden into a blaze of glory.






ANEMONOPSIS MACROPHYLLA

£3.85 Ranunculaceae HP

A Japanese treasure, Delicate ferny leaves beneath stunning nodding flowers. Each bloom displays a wondrous double circle of petals, the outer an almost pure ivory white, whilst the centre is purplish-blue. Totally hardy, will excel in shade and well-prepared organic soil.



ANGELICA SYLVESTRIS 'EBONY'

£3.80 Apiaceae

This fabulous new plant is the darkest of any angelica ever grown. Exquisite, almost black, finely-cut shiny leaves below heads of darkest purple buds opening to delicate sprays of pink flowers. Caused mayhem when first shown at Chelsea. Comes relatively true from seed.



ANGELICA TAIWANIANA

£2.45 Apiaceae

HP.HBi 1.2-1.8m

Football-sized umbels of cream flowers and heads of perfumed seeds are supported on very thick stems above bold fragrant basal foliage. This substantial plant will make an impressive statement in the mid to back border.



ANTHRISCUS SYLVESTRIS 'GOLDEN FLEECE'

70-90cm (20 + seeds)

An old favorite with bright, lemony-yellow, fern-like leaves in early spring making shining, golden mounds which are totally resistant to burning by the sun, with sprays of fluffy white flowers opening later. Few seeds collected but comes almost 100% true from seed.



ANTHRISCUS SYLVESTRIS 'RAVENSWING'

£2.95 Apiaceae

60-90cm (30 + seeds)

This exciting recent discovery produces basal sprays of darkest mahogany-bronze, finely divided ferny foliage, making a perfect foil for the airy umbels of white heads. Ever since being revealed at Chelsea this has been an essential plant in modern gardens.



ANTIRRHINUM 'ANGEL TOWERS'

£2.65 | Scrophulariacea HP,HBi 60-90cm

We have crossed a tall, hardy, wild, perennial antirrhinum with a modern cultivar to produce these tall, shrub-like, constantlyflowering, long-lived, unique and spectacular new plants. Palest pink to reddish-purple flowers open on tall, dividing, shrubby branches.



ANTIRRHINUM BRAUN-BLANOUETII

Numerous spikes of yellow-


throated, pale lemon snapdragons which will gently self-seed wherever they are happy. A trouble free plant from Northern Spain with a very long flowering period.



ANTIRRHINUM MOLLE

£3.15 Plantaginaceae HP

This classy snapdragon is actually a small shrub, with grey, downy leaves and guite large flowers, white or pink with vellow colouring in the throat. Self seeds freely but very liable to hybridize with A. majus forms or other species, the hybrids being more upright.

AQUILEGIA 'ALCHEMIST'S GOLD'

The distilled essence from our beds of Aquilegia 'Alchemists Mix' with the most impressive of the dwarf golden and variegated leaf forms, some of which have pom-pom flowers and are fragrant. These new plants are the pot of gold at the end of

Dark purple to black flowers with unusually prominent yellow stamens open from May to August, This lovely, long-lived, true alpine species, grows in high rocky places, sometimes in limestone areas, but makes a superb garden plant.

Perhaps the first green clematisflowered aquilegia. A superlative form we have selected here. Compressed buds open pale lime green slowly fading to a creamy green sliced-apple colour, before finally ageing to cream.

Collected in the wild by famous plant hunter Josef Halda, this appears to be a selected dwarf form of Aguilegia vulgaris, with deepest inky-blue flowers and thick, glaucous blue-green foliage.

A fantastic mix of double, divided, star shaped Grannies Bonnets ranging from white through shades of pink and red, all being equally attractive, atop elegant ferny foliage. They are hardy, herbaceous, and will gently seed with time.





AQUILEGIA VULGARIS 'ORANGES AND LEMONS'

£2.45 Ranunculaceae HP

This completely new colour range has bicolored flowers in all shade of red, orange and yellow. The occasional 'plum' pops up but adds to the colour scheme! Unlike many aquilegias which give a once-off burst of bloom, these will flower on and on.





ARUM PURPUREOSPATHUM

£5.95 Araceae

A spathe of purple-black surrounds a spadix of almost jet black. Shiny, deep-green leaves lay below. Allegedly, it lacks the bad smell associated with this group. This very rare species is among the most attractive of all Arums, it is found in a small area of SW Crete.






ASPHODELUS ALBUS

£2.55 Asphodelaceae HB,HP 60-90cm

These lovely plants, which surprisingly are completely frosthardy, produce clumps of linear basal leaves, and leafless stems bearing racemes or panicles of star-shaped, white or pink flowers, each tepal with an attractive green or brown central vein.





ASTILBE CHINENSIS 'PUMILA'

£2.95 Saxifragaceae

This exceptional, early summer variety makes a dwarf, groundhugging, rounded clump with feathery plumes of densely clustered red flowers in late summer. This variety has been awarded an RHS Award of Garden Merit (AGM), (Plants of outstanding excellence.)

ASTRANTIA INVOLUCRATA 'SHAGGY'

£2.95 Umbelliferae

This most popular and much improved form of Astrantia major has a much larger "collar", with beautifully coloured tips darkly etched in attractive green shades. It is very long lived indeed and will grow under almost any conditions.



ASTRANTIA MAJOR

£2.50 Umbelliferae

This long-flowering and very long-lived plant displays showy star-like heads with radiating bracts in shades of green, pink and white. Excellent cut flowers are a bonus.

Deadly Nightshade has purplegreen bell flowers, hanging on thick stems with soft leaves. Later appear juicy black berries. Be warned, its common name is true and appropriate. All parts of this plant are extremely poisonous, do not plant where

Flowering from June to August, this is one of the most beautiful early-summer perennials, with trifoliate leaves and erect, lupinlike racemes of rich violet-blue, pea-like flowers, followed by conspicuous inflated pods. They do best in deep, well-drained soil.

BERKHEYA PURPUREA

£3.40 Asphodelaceae HP Bearing the long slender leaves often attributed to most dwarf Kniphofia, this variety has the most intense green-yellow flowers as opposed to the vellow-orange varieties. This dwarf variety was found in South Africa, great for borders



LAVANDULA ANGUSTIFOLIA

£2.35 Labiatae

and cut flowers.

The common lavender will produce long-stemmed, bright blue flowers which are ideal for cutting, drying or to perfume linen. Long-lived and easy-togrow, it benefits from a close haircut early each spring to encourage fresh growth.



LAVANDULA PROVENCE BLUE

£2.70 Labiatae

This exceptionally compact, bushy, clump-forming, evergreen perennial has fragrant silver-green leaves and bears narrow spires of deep blue flowers in summer which are also highly scented and are very good for drying. It is longlived and easy-to-grow.



LAVANDULA SPICATA 'MUFFET'S CHILDREN'

Large flowers of deepest rosecrimson are carried on branching stems bearing attractive grey woolly leaves. This must-have plant for the classic cottage garden will gently self-seed into cracks and shady corners but rarely becomes a nuisance.



LYCHNIS CORONARIA ALBA

The unusual albino form of the traditional cottage garden plant has massed heads of pure white flowers on grev stems above clumps of grev woolly hairy leaves.



LYCHNIS CORONARIA 'ANGEL'S BLUSH'

The pink-eyed white-flowered form of the woolly, grey-leaved Lychnis coronaria comes quite true from seed but the pink eve varies quite bizarrely with the season and weather conditions. A lovely long-lived cottage garden plant.

MECONOPSIS NAPAULENSIS 'PINKY'

Perhaps the most magnificent of all winter rosettes is this enormous beast composed of massive, felted, golden bear'sear-like leaves. In early spring arises the thick stem holding a succession of refined golden silky flowers.

From dense rosettes of silver and golden pelted leaves arise great spikes of sulphur-yellow, silky flowers. One of the most fabulous and impressive plants in moist rich soil. (Experts now believe that the true, genuine Meconopsis regia may be no longer in cultivation.)



MECONOPSIS RUDIS

£3.50 Papaveraceae HP,HBi 30-45cm (20 seeds)

A rare and unusual blue poppy with bristly, spiny stems and leaves and frilly, cobalt-blue flowers with attractive central bosses of white anthers. Flowers are produced over an extended period until late in the year.



MECONOPSIS SUPERBA

£2.95 Papaveraceae

This fabulous plant has gorgeous rosettes of grey-green leaves and strong, hairy stems bearing sprays of sumptuous, golden-eyed, pure white flowers. Found at altitude in Tibet and Bhutan, it has proved easy to grow here in Devon from wild collected seed.



MECONOPSIS VILLOSA

£3.15 Papaveraceae

A choice and extremely desirable perennial poppy with golden-haired rosettes of leaves with many stems carrying wide, nodding, open globes of bright yellow in the leaf axils. Very rarely offered, famous gardener Graham Stuart Thomas sums it up thus, "Superbly beautiful".



MECONOPSIS WILSONII

£3.60 Papaveraceae HP,HBi 1.2-1.5m (20 + seeds)

Newly-described, this rare, exciting and unbelievably exquisite flower bears spectacular heads of closelypacked, golden-eyed, bluepurple flowers, which open over an extended period in late spring on stout hairy stems, and is worth any trouble to grow.



MELANOSELINUM DECIPIENS

£2.65 Apiaceae, Umbel HP

This new umbellifer is certainly one of the finds of recent vears. In its second year a thick strong stem sprouts a broad crown of several branches carrying finely divided bronzed leaves, beneath very large umbels of bright pink flowers. An unforgettable picture.



MELIANTHUS COMOSUS

£2.65 Melianthaceae

A rare, high altitude, hardy dwarf relative of M Major. Silver grey, deeply fingered leaves smelling of hazelnuts when bruised. Maroon flowers with chocolate bracts and green stamens produce large, pale green inflated fruit that children cannot resist popping!



MELIANTHUS MAJOR

£2.90 | Melianthaceae HHSh

The giant with deeply-cut grey leaves. Bizarre, brownish flowers produce inflated seedpods in late summer. "Melianthus has probably the most beautiful large foliage of any plant that can be grown out of doors in these islands". (Graham Stuart Thomas).



MORINA LONGIFOLIA

£3.10 Morinaceae

A rare and long-lived Nepalese plant with thistle-like foliage (but no relation). From the main stem leaf axils appear exotic, flared white flowers, which turn to pink inside after pollination. Repeat flowering from early summer until the frost, especially if dead-headed.

NICOTIANA LIME GREEN

£2.40 Solanaceae HHA

One of the most spectacular of all of the flowering tobaccos, this easy-to-grow annual makes a dazzling display of fragrant, lime-green flowers from early summer onwards, doing best if sown in situ, although it can be sown early under cover before being transplanted.



NICOTIANA SYLVESTRIS

£2.50 Solanaceae HHA

This lovely plant is actually a species of wild tobacco (Woodland Tobacco), grown in gardens for its deeply scented perfume, which is overpowering at night, it attracts pollinating moths. This is one of the plants from which the leaves can be dried for smoking.



NIGELLA DAMASCENA

£2.05 Ranunculaceae HA

Large showy blue flowers open over finely-cut, feathery, almost fern-like foliage and are perfect for cutting, whilst the inflated seed-pods are also popular with flower arrangers. They may gently self-seed but very rarely become a nuisance!



OENOTHERA BLOOD ORANGE

£2.40 Onagaceae

This new and lovely dwarf plant with the same cushion-forming habit as aubreieta, produces an extremely long succession of yellow-rimmed, red-eyed flowers all season long on prostrate stems.

PANCRATIUM MARITIMUM

fragrant, rather daffodil-like flowers open over attractive, flat, blue-grey leaves. This rare and gorgeous flower is classed as endangered, and as thus, is protected and must not be picked in the wild.



PAPAVER RHOEAS

£2.05 Papaveraceae H/

This is the fast-growing poppy which, after the battles, rapidly produced flowers amongst the trenches in the world wars and which is used to commemorate the soldiers who fell. Also known as Flanders Poppy, Corn Poppy, Field Poppy and Red Poppy.



PAPAVER RUPIFRAGUM 'ORANGE FEATHERS'

£2.75 Papaveraceae HP 45-60cm

This sumptuous, manystemmed, double-flowered, long-lived perennial, bears an endless succession of frilly, many-petalled terracotta-orange flowers. Botanically this is Papaver rupifragum 'Flore Pleno', but we feel "Orange Feathers" is less of a mouthful!



PAPAVER SOMNIFERUM 'MIDNIGHT'





This trouble and maintenance free, and quite rare British native climber (The Wood Pea)improves yearly, throwing out enormous numbers of flesh pink flowers on strong stems, being even more vigorous and floriferous than Lathyrus latifolius.



LATHYRUS TINGITANUS ROSEUS

£2.55 | Fabiaceae HHCl,H 1.5-1.8m (10 seeds)

These lovely annuals are just as easy to grow as traditional sweet peas. This scarcer, bicoloured paler form produces masses of coral-rose-pink blooms which will smother fences or archways throughout the summer, or even for longlasting cut flowers.



MAURANDYA 'MAGIC DRAGON' (ERUBESCENS)

£2.25 Scrophulariacea HHCl 2.0-5.0m

In the early 1990's we bred what is probably the first hybrid climbing maurandya ever produced. These incredibly fast growing plants, which possess explosive hybrid vigour, produce a wide range of large flower shapes and sizes in all shades of pink and red.



MUTISIA ILICIFOLIA

£5.10 Asteraceae

Very rarely offered, this superb "Chilean Climbing Gazania" has twining shoots which carry soft, holly-like leaves and large, pinkish-mauve "daisy" flowers. These plants make a breathtaking sight, and are surprisingly hardy with thick, trunk-like stems.

PANDOREA JASMINOIDES

£3.45 Bignoniaceae HHCl,

A profusion of ivory-white/pale pink flowers, with a jasmine-like scent develop in late spring through to autumn. A vigorous climber. Large pointed pods filled with papery seeds form. Thrives on a sheltered sunny wall, or in a pot that can be moved to a frost-free area.



PASSIFLORA CAERULEA

£2.85 Passifloraceae HCl

This lovely exotic-looking climber is quite hardy in sheltered positions where it displays its fragrant, intricately-marked, pale blue flowers in summer. In Autumn plum-sized orange fruits appear filled with edible crunchy pips and sweet, tasty pulp. RHS Award winner.



PASSIFLORA EDULIS

£2.75 Passifloraceae HCl

This vigorous climber has deeply 3-lobed leaves, climbing tendrils and purple-centred frilly white flowers, followed by a crop of purple, edible fruit. Although it is half hardy and may be killed off down to the ground in hard winters, it reliably re-grows from the roots.

A mix of numerous heirloom grandiflora varieties, some old and some new, that have been especially selected for their ability to fill a room with that heady sweet pea perfume. This is probably the best way to grow a good selection so you can pick your favourites!



SWEET PEA 'PRINCE OF ORANGE'

£1.70 Leguminosae

One of our favourites grandiflora forms, this sweetlyperfumed beauty is striking orange, always a rare colour, with a touch of clashing pink! Introduced by famous breeder Morse in 1928, this scarce flower has only recently been reintroduced into circulation!



TROPAEOLUM AZUREUM

£3.70 Tropaeolaceae HHCl

The fabulous blue climbing perennial nasturtium! Thin twining stems produce many dazzling cobalt blue flowers from the leaf axils of delicate, attractively lobed leaves. Dving down to deep resting tubers, this is one of the ultimate alpine house plants.



TROPAEOLUM LEPTOPHYLLUM

£5.25 Tropaeolaceae HP

Possibly not in cultivation it exists in just a few secret places in Chile where these few seeds have been collected. Perennial and hardy it makes a steadilyincreasing tuber producing stems with divided blue-green foliage beneath five-petalled vellow flowers.



TROPAEOLUM POLYPHYLLUM

£5.25 Tropaeolaceae HCl

Billowing trails of blue-grey leaves cascade along the ground or scramble through undergrowth, followed by an overwhelming display of golden yellow ochre flowers opening in June. This gorgeous plant is astonishing when established on a hot well-drained bank.



TROPAEOLUM SPECIOSUM

£3.60 Tropaeolaceae HHCl

Sheets of dazzling scarlet flowers cascading amidst pretty delicate, divided leaves adorn this gorgeous plant throughout midsummer. This fabulous Chilean native prefers peat to be incorporated into the soil, when it will make countless, long-lived hardy tubers.



VINCETOXICUM NIGRUM

£2.70 Apocynaceae **HCI**

Dark purple to black starshaped flowers on terminal trusses form on this vigorous climber from May to mid June. The fruits are slim, green > light brown tapered pods, tightly packed with seeds attached to white puffy fibers that carry them on the wind.

ABIES KOREANA

This exceptionally handsome, easily grown and diseaseresistant tree produces extremely ornamental, violetpurple cones even on small trees. It also has highly aromatic foliage, which, when crushed, has a strong fruity orange smell.



ACER GRISEUM (PAPER-BARK MAPLE)

£2.85 Aceraceae

2.4-4.5m (12 seeds)

An outstandingly lovely ornamental tree with orangecinnamon coloured bark which peels back revealing the smooth shiny new bark beneath. In autumn the entire tree seems to be ablaze as the leaves turn deep crimson-red.



ALBIZIA JULLIBRISSIN

£3.95 MIMOSACEAE

A wide spreading tree. Very fine, fern like, divided foliage. Pink flowers, with a sweet perfume form in summer and early autumn. Later flat seed pods form. Leaves gradually close at night or during periods of rain, bowing down as though sleeping.



ARAUCARIA ARAUCANA

£3.95 Araucariaceae

Leathery, spine-tipped leaves clad long spidery branches, which are geometrically arrayed around the trunk like spokes of a wheel. One level is produced each year enabling the age of the tree to be calculated. When mature this is one of the most graceful and noble trees.



ARONIA MELANOCARPA

£3.95 Rosaceae

HSh

This underrated shrub has attractive white flowers with pink anthers and gleaming, shiny leaves. Later, clusters of black berries form. Resistant to many diseases, possessing multiple medicinal properties. A hardy, vigorous plant, it survives most conditions.





BAOBAB TREE (ADANSONIA DIGITATA)







HONEY BUBBLES

Heavy bunches of true cherrysized, as sweet-as-honey fruits explode in your mouth. The colour and size of white grapes, they are actually smaller than most cherry tomatoes but bigger than a currant tomato, are easy-to-grow and heavy cropping too! (Cordon)

Follow Torquay signs to Penn Inn Roundabout (Traffic light


FROM EXETER:
